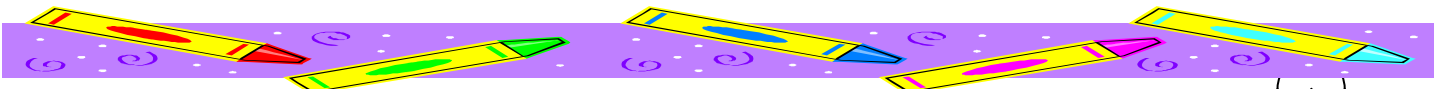
think and don't hesitate to contact me in the future if you have an idea of how our school can operate more effectively. It takes all of us working together to make Kendrick Lakes the best school it can be.

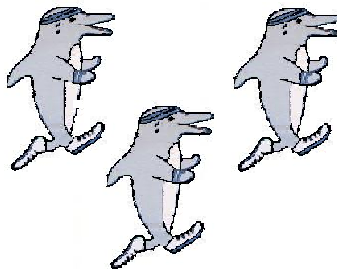

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS:

Every school year a new application is required, for all students, for the Free and Reduced Price Meal Program. Please use a current 2011-2012 meal application and fill out in black or blue ink.

- a) If your child(ren) were on the Free and Reduced Meal Program on the last day of the 2010-2011 school year, that status (free or reduced) will be carried over until a new application is processed, or October 3, 2011 (last day for carry over status). Please reapply early to insure your child will not be dropped from the program. We are hoping to begin online applications beginning with the 2011-2012. If approved by the CDE online applications will be accepted beginning July 22, 2011. Go to applyforlunch.com to complete your application. Applications will be available at the school and can be filled out after July 22, 2011.
- b) School Based fees may be waived if you complete and sign the INFORMATION RELEASE SECTION on the application.
- c) Students pre-approved through the Food Stamp Direct Certification process will receive a Direct Cert approval letter & Direct Certification Information Release form in the mail prior to the start of school. You may return the completed & signed Information Release Form for Students Approved through Direct Certification for school based fees to be waived. Direct Certification approval is done by student, not by family. PLEASE check to make sure you have received a letter of approval for each child in your family. To Our Jeffco Family:

We are humbled and amazed at the outpouring of support that we have received in light of the announcement of the suspension of the Outdoor Education Programs at Mount Evans and Windy Peak. We recognize that this is an extraordinary time in the history of our school district and that budget reductions will impact every family and student in Jeffco.

We are faced with the suspension of the Outdoor Lab program until we are able to become self supporting. Currently fees collected from students pay for just under half of our operating costs (approximately \$800,000). The district's general fund pays for the other half of our costs (approximately \$900,000). In addition, money from the district's capital funds pay to maintain the major projects needed at our sites.

To open Outdoor lab for the 2011-2012 school year we must raise \$900,000. This is doable! Our best case scenario would be to have raised that money by May 2011. However, to make this attainable we have set the following targets. We need a minimum of \$600,000 by June 15. At least half of that amount needs to be collected and available. The other half can be as cash donations or pledges from corporations, service clubs, or organizations. We will need the remaining \$300,000 by December 2011.

We can do this if you will help!

DONATE! Donations can be made to the Outdoor Lab Foundation at outdoorlabfoundation.org. There are 300,000 alumni of the Outdoor Lab program – imagine if everyone gave \$1.00 we could meet this goal! **Any amount will help!** All donations are tax deductible and we will happily provide documentation for any donor. All donations will be used only for Outdoor Lab.

Provide us with known contacts! We know that there are many corporations, service clubs, and organizations that would be willing to help if we were able to connect with them and provide information on donating to Outdoor Lab. If you know of a corporation, service club, or of any organization that would be willing to donate, please send us their contact information. Support Community Fundraisers! Please support fundraising activities by volunteering and participating. Imagine if every one of our 150 schools were able to raise \$2,000 we would have \$300,000 toward our goal! IMPORTANT IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

To the parents/Guardians of 5th grade students:

For the school year 2011-2012, Colorado School Entrance and Immunization Law requires that your student's immunizations are current and that you provide proof of immunization to attend school.

Immunizations for sixth grade entry are:

DtaP/DTP	5 doses OR 4 if 4th dose given on or after 4th birthday
Tdap	1 dose required (NEW REQUIREMENT)
Polio	4 doses OR 3 if 3rd dose was given on or after 4th birthday
Hepatitis B	3 doses
MMR	2 doses
Varicella	1 dose (2 doses recommended) or history of disease

PROOF OF IMMUNIZATIONS will be required at REGISTRATION IN AUGUST 2011.

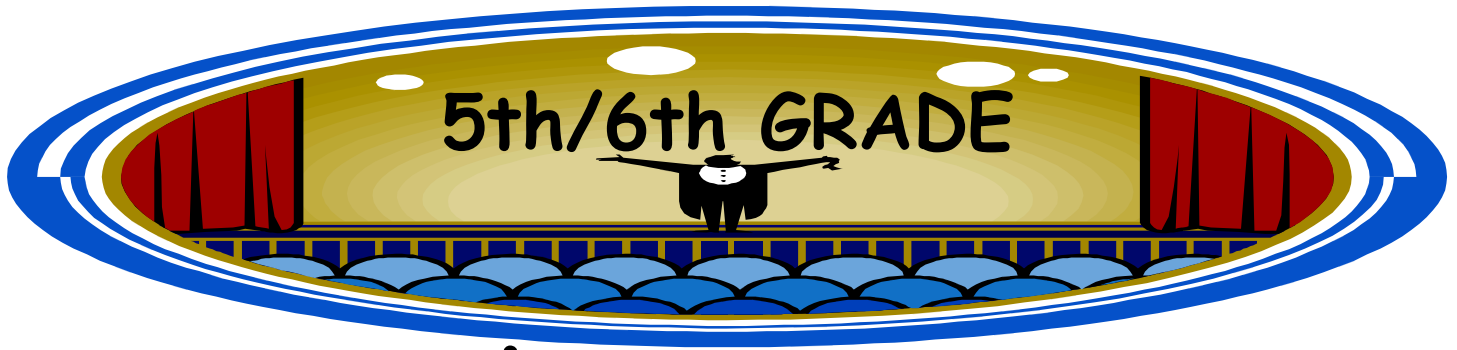

Expedition Northwest!

Boarding an airplane and traveling to a place where lack of rain is not a problem takes much preparation. Our expedition to the Pacific Northwest has been no walk in the park to arrange. Much consideration and careful thought have gone into the planning of this trip, from the itinerary to the food we eat and the places we'll stay while we're there. Yet, to the fifth and sixth graders of Mr. Hansen's class, all of this extra effort is worth putting toward this immense privilege.

Waves tumble upon the shore with a brilliant crimson horizon in the background. Life is extraordinary when you wake up in the morning to the sound of the tide entering the beach like a visitor and then quickly receding back to its home, the ocean blue. To go on this astounding adventure, though, many arrangements needed to be made. These included fundraisers to lower the cost, background knowledge to prepare us for what we will see and do, and the planning of the trip itself (designing menus, reserving beach-front houses, and imagining the learning experiences that will take up the bulk of the trip). All fundraisers are complete (Butter Braids, See's Candies, Christmas wreaths, and products we created and marketed through our classroom company, including greeting cards, calendars, and bookmarks) and were very profitable. Currently, we are building schema about the Pacific Northwest: climatology, ecology, geology, botany, and zoology.



Upon arrival in Portland, Oregon, we will dine at Foster Burger and drive to Mt. Tabor Park, where we will explore the diverse biotic elements of the Pacific Northwest ecosystem. The rest of the day consists of driving to our beach houses, getting settled in, and walking along the coast to The Pelican for dinner. The next day starts off with a home-cooked breakfast and an excursion to the Oregon Coast Aquarium. After we tour this attraction, we will head back to Pacific City to explore the tidal pools found along the beach and hike through Siuslaw National Forest. On our last day, we will drive to Mt. St. Helens and explore geology of the region. Finally, we'll head back to the airport and get on the plane home, ending our trip on a splendid note.
