### Community

I am proud to be part of the KLES community for many reasons. This community is extraordinarily generous and we give in many ways throughout the year. Giving opportunities abound and KLES PTA encourages you to give in a way that is meaningful to you and your family.

Is the safety of our children worth a small donation? We'll use all donations to purchase gifts for 44 under privileged children in our neighborhood.

The KLES student council, led by 1st grade teacher Mrs. Fabrizio, will organize each grade to collect coins and have a friendly competition to see which grade can earn the most points. Coins in your own grade's jar ADD points to your team, dollar bills in your rival's jar SUBTRACT points from their jar. Sneaky!

The coin drive will end on Friday the 13<sup>th</sup>. The goal is to collect \$3 per KLES student, which gives us \$25 to spend on clothes and a gift for each child. ### Academics

Do you have questions or concerns about the implementation of Common Core Standards? These new standards mean greater academic rigor and more consistent measures of achievement applied across Colorado and the nation. There are resources to help parents understand how the Common Core Standards affect students. KLES Principal Dave Singh, Instructional Coach Bridget Clark-Cooper, as well as your child's teacher, can answer questions.

Mr. Singh has drawn our attention to the concept of depth of knowledge at the recent Accountability and PTA meetings. Depth of knowledge means the level of thinking students can demonstrate. For example, at level 1 depth of knowledge a student is able to match, identify, and recite information. In contrast, at level 4 a student is able to apply concepts, create something based on their learning, and make connections between ideas.
